The occasion for **Ps. 46** is probably the ensuing (701 B.C.) attempted attack on Jerusalem, the capital of Judah, when God stepped in and defensively and dramatically protected Jerusalem from Assyrian aggression and invasion (**2 Kings 19:35**).
